Pakeezah Rajab provided insights into social media presence and growth, again highlighting team efforts to learn new communication/design methods to increase engagement.



As with previous years, Facebook continues to be our fastest-growing social media page, with 462 new followers joining the page since our last AGM.



We have witnessed an increase of 52 Instagram followers over the past year.






5.3. Expertise database

Our Research Collaboration Network (previously known as the Expertise Database) portfolio is headed up by Nabeelah Bemath.

The network was established to connect researchers, methodologists, students and supervisors, to facilitate collaboration, knowledge production and skills development in the research of psychology and thereby contribute to addressing the psychological needs of our society.

The Executive Committee has been working with Head Office to review the information in the database and make the database accessible to PsySSA members, and in doing so, a rebrand of this database was also suggested.
